TERMS OF REFERENCE

December 2014

Background

The University is beginning work on a new masterplan for West Cambridge which will set out a comprehensive development strategy for the site. As well as proposing additional academic and commercial research space, the masterplan is expected to include shared facilities and social amenity space and a comprehensive package of sustainable transport measures to transform accessibility by sustainable modes of travel. It is envisaged that a planning application for the West Cambridge masterplan will be submitted to Cambridge City Council in Summer 2015, and the West Cambridge Community Group will be one method of engagement with the local community that will be used to inform the emerging development proposals and the application process.

The West Cambridge Community Group

The West Cambridge Community Group will be comprised of up to 25 representatives of stakeholder groups from the local community at and around the West Cambridge site. Its members will be drawn from representatives of the city and parish councils; local interest groups; local and on-site residents; and organisations that provide community and public facing facilities on the site. A Chair and Deputy Chair will be sought from the group. The University will provide administrative support to facilitate the group's meetings, as well as technical information and presentations from its team and/or consultants.

Through this advisory group, the University hopes to hear, examine, share and explore thoughts and opinions about the existing West Cambridge site and the emerging masterplan proposals. It is hoped that through the Community Group, a dialogue between the local community and University can be established that will inform the West Cambridge proposals and help deliver improvements to the area through future development of the site.

The group will meet every two months as appropriate and needed through the masterplanning process, and the areas of focus for future meetings will be determined through issues raised and actions agreed during preceding meetings.

The outcomes of discussions will be reported regularly to the West Cambridge Project Board and a record of the meetings will be posted on a microsite for the West Cambridge masterplan, which will also provide supporting documentation for the forthcoming planning application for the masterplan proposals to illustrate community engagement.
